# A PUBLIC READING OF AN UNPRODUCED SCREENPLAY ABOUT THE DEATH OF WALT DISNEY

### INT. YOUNG CENTRE, BAILLIE THEATRE - NIGHT

Mitchell (white, mid/late 30s, bearded, a little haggard), sits in the back of the darkened theatre, while a flurry of tech work occurs onstage. He is hunched over a laptop while holding a mug of tea, attempting to write his long-overdue director's note, so as not to (further) delay the printing of the program.

### MITCHELL

Here is a non-exhaustive list of events that have occurred in the eleven years since this play first premiered, that have been on my mind throughout rehearsals: 1) Elon Musk tweets "Nuke Mars", and then nukes Twitter; 2) Donald Trump becomes President Donald Trump, but by all appearances, remains miserable; 3) Jeff Bezos and Richard Branson launch themselves into space just days apart - but refuse to carpool; 4) Google fails in its pilot for an "Experimental Prototype City of Tomorrow" on Toronto's waterfront; 5) We all learn the word submersible; 6) I read Evan Osnos' New Yorker article "Doomsday Prep for the Super-Rich", and then think about it on a near daily basis from then on. 7) In 2018, leading scientists warn the UN that we only have 12 years to mitigate climate catastrophe, and I realize that I am typing this at almost exactly the halfway point.

Mitchell gingerly takes a sip of his tea (earlier that day he noticed that the milk in the greenroom fridge was expired, but he's decided to live dangerously).

### MITCHELL

I'm not sure whether it makes me feel better or worse to realize that so many of our billionaires seem to be gaping holes of emptiness - eternally searching for an escape, and yet also for the prolongement of their supremacy. I do wonder about what would happen if we could successfully crack the code on cryonics, and assure them that they could be first in line for the great thaw? That this pesky mortality business need not apply to them. Perhaps then they might focus a little more on how to sustain the health of the world around us, and a little less on what's up there in space, or lurking in the great depths of the sea?

I'm deeply grateful to our amazing team at OtM, our fabulous partners at Soulpepper, this incredible group of artists, my brilliant assistant director Lucy Coren, our dedicated donors and supporters, and most of all to-

INT. WEYNI MENGESHA'S KITCHEN, TORONTO - DAY

Weyni (Black, 40's, a multitasker and optimist)

Sits in her kitchen writing an AD note early in the morning, she sips her second cup of coffee and is frequently interrupted by her children, feeling pressured to make the program deadline, but happy that Mitchell's delayed director's note has bought her some more time.

#### WEYNI

We loved the idea of partnering with Outside the March on this timely play. The pairing of this company, who has made a name for themselves working outside of the box, and this incredibly inventive playwright, Lucas Hnath, felt like a very fruitful combination.
