I love the plays of Chekhov.

I love Chekhov for his recognition that we live our lives enslaved in our selves. No one in Chekhov's plays is free of the self, of the habits and opinions and conditions of the self, or of the anguish that comes from the craving for a fixed identity, the endless assertions of self: I am an actress, I'm a doctor, I'm so poor, I am so unhappy, I'm insignificant...

I love that Chekhov characters often declaim their fate: I will tear love out of my heart, I will become an actress, I will shoot myself, I will go to Moscow. But fate sometimes goes unfulfilled. Fate does not speak through the human tongue, if it speaks at all.

I love him because he finds no solution in grand ideas, in declaring meaning. Chekhov is inclined to uncover meaning that already exists in our human interdependence. Chekhov's people are bound to each other (as you the audience will be bound to the actor for this evening, and the actor to you). Meaning exists in this bond. And those who declare that "there is no meaning in life" are not expressing a grand truth about life, but escaping from the ethical claims that others have on us, claims that would make our lives meaningful, but also more difficult.

I love Chekhov because his plays are comical symphonies, working in dimensions of time and space, in the body and in language. The characters remain unknown to themselves in the flux of words and time. Time is a tyrannical pressure, a shimmering mirage, a laugh, a dream.

I love his cheekiness and wit. And his tenderness, especially for those who yearn.

Llove him because he blames no one.

Through his art he imbues the confusion of time, the infinitesimal travails of human experience as well as the infinite dance of eons, he imbues it all with perplexity and love.

## **Background Notes**

There are so many English language adaptations of Anton Chekhov's plays that the New York Times recently wondered if the Dramatist's Guild required every playwright to produce one as a condition of membership. *The Seagull* is an especially popular choice for reincarnation. Even Tennessee Williams tried it in 1981, calling his version *The Notebook of Trigorin*.

The adaptor of the version you will see tonight, British playwright Simon Stephens, is a passionate devotee of the Russian master and he makes no bones about it: "In his plays and stories, he (Chekhov) has excavated the human condition with more tenderness and honesty than anyone else I've ever read." Stephens does not speak Russian, however, so he created this version from a literal translation, a somewhat unorthodox choice in some circles. He had no interest in a historically accurate rendering. His stated goal was to focus on the vitality, sensuality, rage, and compassionate spirt of the original.

The hilarious and heartfelt result is a deep dive into the heart of the play: a clash of generations that explores our longing for love and attention, our desire to make our mark, the fear that we'll be forgotten. Director Daniel Brooks says this adaptation might not please purists, but Stephens brings Chekhov into our century without sacrificing the structure, tone, and characters of the original. In spare and evocative language, he invites actors to inhabit every corner of these contradictory characters.

Stephens says plays are not literary. They are a starting point for a night in the theatre. Welcome to your night. We are so glad you are here.

## Playwright Bio

Anton Chekhov is an acknowledged master of playwriting but in his day theatre audiences did not immediately embrace him: *The Seagull* was almost booed off the stage at its premiere. *Uncle Vanya* and *Cherry Orchard* were more popular, though international fame came only after his death. A practising physician, Chekhov drew creative inspiration from those he treated, as well as from the active social life he enjoyed. He died in 1904 at the age of 44.

# **Adaptor Biography**

Simon Stephens is a powerhouse of contemporary British theatre. His work embraces original plays and adaptations and he's known for experimentation and rigorous collaboration with directors and actors. Like Chekhov, his work combines comedy and tragedy, favouring energy and unpredictability over convention. Stephens is a professor of writing at the University of Manchester and counts a capybara among his immediate family members.

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






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












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
